

What is the UNRMS?

The **United Nations Resource Management System (UNRMS)** is a global framework developed by the **UNECE** to guide the **sustainable and equitable use of natural resources**. It uses **12 key principles** derived from the **UN Framework Classification (UNFC)** to deliver this.

Purpose and Benefits

Enables holistic, transparent, and equitable management of resources across environmental, social, and economic dimensions.

It aligns resource governance with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) from the 2030 agenda and supports the transition to circular, future-facing economies.

Key Features and Tools

Provides a flexible, principles-based framework that includes:

- A common language and terminology
- Lifecycle and systems-thinking tools
- Data standards and classification structures
- Practical guidelines for planning, decision-making, and implementation

Stakeholders and Applications

Designed for use by governments, industry, investors, researchers and communities, including Indigenous Peoples.
